Subject: Deferment of the Henry Keogh Acquittal and Release Program

Dear Isobel,

At 8:27AM (Qld time) on Thursday, 29 March 2012 I received a phone call from Henry Keogh effectively asking that – for the time being – the directors of The Australian Justice Tribunal defer the ASIC registration of the Henry Keogh Fund. He further requested that I personally (given my involvement in The Grand Jury of South Australia) ensure that this newly formed Organisation is placed temporarily on hold, and that accordingly the website, www.GrandJurySA.org, be deactivated.

These requests – unexpected and ‘urgent in nature’ after four weeks into his Acquittal and Release Program – were made in light of advices he had received the previous evening. Apparently, there is now the immediate likelihood of success through a tack being taken by his pro bono legal team. We trust, that after nearly sixteen and a half years of trying everything else within the available legal processes, this new team will succeed with their fresh approach and get Henry back into a Court of Criminal Appeal. In the interim, we will honour his wishes.

On a very personal note, it has been pleasing to speak with staff of Members of the House of Assembly and Legislative Council. Their courtesy has, without exception, demonstrated that we are all Australians first and South Australians, Queenslanders, etc., second.

I will await the possibility of further instructions from Henry. Until then and beyond, please accept my best wishes for the future.
